This Deed made and entered into this the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1873, between George H. Dardel and Pauline J. Dardel, his wife, parties of the first part, and David H. Bryant, trustee for Charles E. Bryant and Benjamin J. Bryant, parties of the second part, witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of four thousand dollars and credits, and of the sum of one dollar to them paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, by the said parties of the second part, and confirmed and carry into the said parties of the second part, the following described real estate situate and bounded as follows: To wit, one hundred and fifty acres more or less, lying on the old River, and bounded by the land of William E. Bryant, C. O. Saxe and wife and others, known as the Bryant's Island of land, formerly owned by Joseph Farwell dec'd. It shall and hold the same with all appurtenances, to the parties of the second part or their heirs or assigns. In trust, however for the following purpose: Whereas the said George H. Dardel and Pauline J. Dardel, his wife, are fully indebted to Charles E. Bryant and Benjamin J. Bryant, parties of the second part, in the sum of one hundred, twenty five dollars, twenty five cents, if they do amount paid by them, the parties of the second part (Charles E. Bryant and Benjamin J. Bryant), unto their two sons, to wit, for the benefit of George H. Dardel a party, the first part, and also agrees and consents to the parties of the second part, to cause all taxes to be paid as the above described place or the land may direct, and the said Charles E. Bryant and Benjamin J. Bryant, do, agree that the said George H. Dardel shall have five years to pay the above amount of one hundred and twenty five dollars and twenty five cents, with legal interest until paid up to secure that to & to be paid by my son for any deficiency at the end of five years, and that we the parties of the second part do further agree that the said George H. Dardel shall have control of and may sell any or all timber as the place aboves mentioned, provided, the proceeds of said timber be applied to the payment of the above indebtedness. And if the above amount paid by George H. Dardel at or before the expiration of the five years above mentioned, than the above named property shall be retained and his debt shall be void, and the parties of the second part, consent, jointly to forgive of all the trust herein created.
