whereas the said Dardur died by his last will and Testament, making and enacting his personal
representative to sell all of his real Estate, and himself by virtue of said authority, the said Thomas W.
Butler, Administrator, with the will annex of said Dardur has sold all of said real Estate, and
Joseph B. Prince received the purchase and has paid to the said Totals a certain sum of the
purchase money. Now therefore in consideration of the payments heretofore made to the said Thomas W.
Butler, Administrator with the will annex of said Jonathan Dardur deceased doth agree and say
to the said Joseph B. Prince and his heirs forever with special warranty, the following parts of
the real Estate formerly belonging to the Estate of Jonathan Dardur are taught off the part
of said land lying north of a line beginning at a switch gully tree on the road leading from
Dardur to Shiloh, which said gully is by the side of a fence line and close to the road, about half
way across said road, and the said land lies there and extends to a small ridge back east
