

The Deed of said date the 28th day of December 1772 between George & Prudence with Virginia & his wife of the first part James & Prudence Trustees of the second part and J. J. Woodcock of the third part: In Witness whereof in Consideration of the Sum of seven hundred and thirty pounds to wit the first Consideration of one hundred and thirty pounds paid by the said James & Prudence Trustees the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said George & Prudence with Virginia & his wife do grant and convey unto the said J. J. Woodcock Clerk of the Court of Wards and Guardians of the said County of Stafford in full and sole possession of the said Building or Buildings to be the same now or hereunto hereunto as follows to wit the said Building or Buildings on the Southside of the Street which is bounded by the said J. J. Woodcock's field thence going east a line of Chapel Lane across the said Building leading from Brumby's to Brumby's Building to a white Oak a line of 20 feet to the west side of said County Road thence going north a line of Chapel Lane to said East Road above or west of Brumby's thence running North East down said East Road from the Southside to the Highway at the above said East Lane here having the Lot or Parcel of Land and Building which the said George & Prudence by Deed of the 28th day of December 1772 do give unto the said J. J. Woodcock and his heirs forever the said parcel of Land and Building the fragment of a Brick and Chertone due to J. J. Woodcock for eight hundred and twenty four 25/100 of a penny bearing same date with this Deed with interest four pence at the rate of eight per cent per annum with the money to be paid accordingly and it is further stipulated and agreed upon by the parties to the said Deed that the said George & Prudence do hereby the Building or said Lot and Building to be hereunto in some good and convenient Building for one thousand Dollars for the benefit of the said J. J. Woodcock in discharge of which the said J. J. Woodcock has taken the date of the said Mortgage for said Building the sum of 2000 Dollars in the sum of 2000 Dollars of said Deed it is further agreed upon by the parties to the said Deed that the said J. J. Woodcock can in his option any time after twelve months from the date of this Deed or the said Twelve to have said property for said Deed with all after giving twenty days notice of time and place of sale shall to choose, and after paying any necessary expenses attending the landing of the Deed including the Commission of four per cent from the said J. J. Woodcock in his option the amount due here upon shall be included and the balance of any sum due to the said George & Prudence or his legal representatives and the said George & Prudence shall be the following signatures of the said
