Coffey, of the State of Virginia, parties of the second part, Witnesseth that the parties of the first part got an immediate release of the debt to them paid and in consideration of a debt incurred by the parties of the second part unto William of Coffey to said Mary Fancher, heirs, assigns, legatees and heirs and assigns, as by their several grants, legacies and wills that each party of the second part, all that tract of land in Southwestern County, in the State of Virginia, as against the parties of the second part was united, being now the land owned by the said T. Benjamin C. Coffey as the heirs of his death in said County of Southwestern to hold and to hold unto the said parties of the second part during their joint lives and during the lives of the survivors of them, and so to the death of the last one of the two, the said land was to be the property of the said Mary Fancher and her heirs. The release of the said parties of the first part has been made by their death and death.
