This Deed made the 2d day of January 1874, Henry S. Hill, John S. Everett, and Coralia M. Everett his wife, Richard L. Bryant and Martha L. Bryant his wife of the first part and Samuel H. Hill of the second part witness Henry S. Hill, John S. Everett and Coralia M. Hill his wife Richard L. Bryant and Richard L. Bryant his wife and Samuel H. Hill aforesaid persons in witness hand of land in Staunton County, Henry S. Hill did swear and before me estimated to contain 1170 acres and whereon the said property during a division of the same have agreed that the said lands shall be valued at five thousand dollars and divided into two lots numbered one and two and I, John S. Everett by this deed do number one and pay Henry S. Hill one thousand dollars his full interest in the said lands all the other parties relinquishing their interest in the said lot number one and Samuel H. Hill shall remain his and pay Richard L. Bryant and Martha L. Hill his wife and thousand dollars their full interest in the said lands lot number two. And therefore this deed witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand to the said persons for Richard L. Bryant and Martha L. Bryant in hand paid by Samuel H. Hill the said Henry S. Hill, John S. Everett and Coralia M. Everett, Richard L. Bryant and Martha L. Bryant have granted, bargained and sold with general warranty to Samuel H. Hill a certain tract of land lying in Staunton Hill bounded as follows to wit containing 220 acres more or less bounded South by the Virginia State, North Carolina line, West by the old Caudin road from Bear bridge to Piney Creek, North by the H. McSpikes and Henry R. Hales lands and East by the lands of H. McSpikes. At witness the following signatures and seals.
