This Book of Deed made this 24th day of January 1844, between J. Jaques of one part, Joseph Blenner trustee of second part, Whitefield, that in consideration of the sum of one thousand pounds paid him and Jaques with general warrant after named promised the said party of the first part his grant and convey with general warrant to said J. Jaques, trustee of aforesaid, to land and the like lying the following real estate to wit: an undivided moiety of a tract of land situated in Southampton County, containing 140 acres, be the same more or less, bounded by the lands of Mr. Whitefield, George Blenner, Oliver Blenner and the Whitney land, together it being said land that formerly belonged to Joseph Blenner and his trust to whom a tract of land in Whitefield given by J.
