Garrison of second part, witnesses that in consideration of the sum of ten hundred dollars, the said parties of the first part, do grant and convey to the said third party with general warranty, the following land situate in a certain tract of land situated in Schoharie County, containing 470 acres, to the land and a life, bounded by the lands of J. M. Crofts, Wm. A. Crofts & Co. Susan Taylor Co. A. Portland, Maria Boycott and others, do hereby to record a debt, due to the said Geo. Boycott by note for five hundred and twenty seven & 1/2 dollars due and payable Feb. 9th 1874. Credited Jan. 1st 1874 for ten hundred dollars. But it is expressly understood that Geo. Boycott wife of James Boycott, does not by this deed relinquish her dower right of said land in fully one of the land hereby conveyed, the same being quantity purchased by James
