This Indent made this 15th day of February, 1772, between John Telf and Martha his wife
 of the first part, and Anne S. Telf of the second part, all of the County of Southampton, State
 of Virginia, Witnesses, that he the said John Telf and Martha Telf his wife, for and in
 consideration of the sum of two hundred and eighty eight dollars, do grant and convey, with the
 said Anne S. Telf and his heirs forever, his certain piece of land, situated in the County of
 Southampton, the said land being a portion of the said John Telf's original tract and parcel 33 acres
 bounded as follows, to wit by a small called "gassy brook" bounded by the lands of John
 Telf, and of the North and West by the lands of the said Anne S. Telf, the said land four
 bounded as follows, on the East by a little branch called "more the said John Telf's part,
 bounded by the lands of John Telf to the General land, and West and North by the lands of
 Anne S. Telf, and said to contain 120 Acres, and the said Anne S. Telf and Catherine Telf
 his wife for himself his heirs and assigns on behalf of Mr. Telf his wife and her heirs,
 with agreement generally the property hereby conveyed, Southampton the following signature in
 state this.
