Carter, of the second party, all of the County of Greenwich and State of Connecticut, witness that he and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand paid, by the party of the second party at a before the sealing and delivery of this instrument, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the party of the first party have given, granted, bargained and sold, and to the said J. H. Egglehart and wife, good, grange, arable land unto the party of the second party, with general warranty, a certain tract of land being and following being in the County of Greenwich & containing thirty acres more or less and bounded as follows, beginning at a large pine, in the land between the lands belonging to said J. H. Egglehart and the land belonging to the estate of Remond S. Briggs, at the Cabin Point Road, thence along said Cabin Road, north east to a large pine (a first and old tree in the Briggs land), near a red oak, chaffed a corner, for said John T.
