This Writ made the 5th day of March 1773 between Dennis F. Royster of the County of Southhampton of the first part and M. M. Abshere of the County of West of North and South West of the County of Southhampton of the second part Witness That he was in consideration of the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (seven hundred and seventy five in two parts) the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) and two notes and against C. A. Allison for the sum of one hundred and eighty seven dollars and fifty cents the other against John C. Cliffe for a like sum - having this date and payable on the first of January 1774 with the certain interests. The party of the first part did grant bargain and sell to the parties of the second part their lands or assigns, and the pine timber on that part of his land lying on the West side of the North river and in the County of Southhampton adjoining the land of Abshere, James Proun and Britt, Britt and Britt - which piece of land contains one hundred and fifty acres and a half. The said party of the first part doth grant unto the parties of the second part their heirs or assigns perfect right of ingress and egress on the land - to Charles Carter, over stone, thence and to the distance of 100 rods more or less according to measurement around the timber from the line of the said party of the first part to a line in the said timber as a sufficient quantity of the same to insure the payment of the tax above mentioned notes. The party of the first part doth promise with the party of the second part that he has the right to convey the above mentioned property and will and do cannot guarantee the title to the same.
