Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 25<sup>th</sup> day of January 1874.  
between S. F. Bain of the City of Norfolk and Samp. C. Davis of the other part Williamsburg. That  
whereas the said S. F. Bain and Samp. C. Davis entered into a Partnership at Williamsburg  
during January under the name and style of Bain and Davis at Portsmouth and New Market  
and also R. M. & C. Bain and Samp. C. Davis in County of Sussex and Southampton &c. and intended  
to conduct said business to this day under said name and style to the day (that is the 27<sup>th</sup>  
day of January 1874) when by mutual Consent the said Partnership was dissolved after the  
day of January 1874.

Excluded from the following terms and conditions - The party of the second part doth by these presents grant  
unto S. F. Bain language and all of his right title and interest least, and half in said firm heretofore existing  
by said parties to the party of the first part upon the following terms to wit, that is to say that whether account  
be settled by the said S. F. Bain to the firm of Bain and Davis, else the entire account shall  
be paid by the said S. F. Bain to the firm of Bain and Davis, else the entire account shall  
be paid by Mr. A. J. Taylor of Sunny County Georgia else the entire account shall be paid by Mr.  
Savious Davis to the said firm as appears by the books of the said account and for the additional  
sum of One thousand dollars the same to be paid to the said S. F. Bain by the said S. F. Bain  
which is evidenced by a Bond for the same bearing over date hereof purpolly a demand, that the said  
party the second by that present shall set transfor and relinquish all claim and demand in and to  
the body proper lands, rights of Trust and all the real estate held by the firms of Bain and Davis  
upon the express terms and conditions that the said S. F. Bain party of the first part doth by  
that present, Covenant and bind himself to appear individually and to pay off all outstanding  
debts of every kind and description that is the case that by the said firm of Bain and Davis  
in Norfolk, Southampton and elsewhere and the said party of the first party specially, Cognac and  
lands himself to said firm for his and his family the said Samp. C. Davis from all of the expenses  
of this Contract according to the true intent and purpose of the same. And to leave a balance  
as here accounts set up hands and affixed our seal the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1874.
