This Act made the 22<sup>d</sup> day of February in the year 1874, between Henry S. Pitt of the one part, and John S. Becker trustee of the other part Winchester that the said H. S. Pitt did grant unto the said J. S. Becker the trustees the following property, to wit: house and household and kitchen furniture and tract of land containing thirty and seven acres more or less lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as follows and the well known Supplemental deed of James H. Ward, Water C. H. Scarborough in trust to secure a debt due to said H. S. Scarborough of two hundred and fifty four dollars due the 7<sup>th</sup> day of November 1872. Articles of Agreement made and entered into the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1874, between S. F. Davis of the one part and Doug. C. Davis of the other part Winchester. That whereas the said S. F. Davis and Doug. C. Davis entered into a Partnership at Winchester during business under the firm and style of Davis and Davis at Philadelphia and New Orleans and the N. R. & C. Rail Road in Counties of Sussex and Southampton Va. and continued so to conduct said business to this day under said firm and style to this day (that is to the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1874) when by mutual consent the said Partnership was dissolved upon the

Ground of Flouring corn and Cattle. The party of the second part doth by these presents grant unto S. F. Davis Virginia and all of his right title and interest land and half in said firm hereafter existing by and through to the party of the first part upon the following terms to wit: that as long as whatever amount may be due by the said D. C. Davis to the firm of Davis and Davis, also the entire amount due said firm by Mr. A. A. Taylor of Smy County Virginia also the entire amount due by Mr. S. C. Davis to the said firm as appears by the books of the said concern and for the additional sum of One thousand dollars the said S. F. Davis to be paid to the said D. C. Davis by the said S. F. Davis which is witnessed by a bond for the same bearing and seal herewith appended a demand, the said party the second by these presents doth sell transfer and relinquish all claim and demand in and to the books papers lands Bonds of Credit and all the real estate held by the firm of Davis and Davis upon the express terms and conditions that the said S. F. Davis party of the first part doth by these presents consent and agree and bind himself to pay off all outstanding debts of every kind and description that is the day due by the said firm of Davis and Davis at Philadelphia and New Orleans and the said party of the first part especially obligates and binds himself to said firm (and his and assigns) the said Doug. C. Davis and all of the proceeds of his estate and demands not outstanding or settling against the said firm of Davis and Davis firmly by these presents binding himself, his heirs and assigns to faithfully carry out and complete the liquidation of the concern according to the true intent and purposes of the same. And testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands and affixed our seals the 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1874.
