the said Henry Myrick, on the first day of March, each year, until date of the next to be
paid, then the legal representatives of the said Henry Myrick, shall have a clear discretion to order the said title
of such timber to be sold for cash, after giving twenty days notice of the sale to
the said John C. Norton, and all persons claiming to be the owners of the land, and
the said severed legal commissions, pay all that Henry Myrick is due on the said note, principal
and interest to the said Henry Myrick, or his legal representatives, and the balance of the
