This Deed of Trust made this 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1874 between Plaintiff and  
 Defendant and Plaintiff his wife of the first part & J. F. Parkinson Trustee of the second part and  
 Joseph H. Parkinson of the third part Pittsfield. That in Consideration of the sum of five dollars  
 to hand paid the said parties of the first part do grant and convey with general warranty  
 to said P. F. Parkinson, Trustee at present, the following personal Estate to wit 15 head  
 of cattle 20 hogs, 3 horses and mules, with their respective merrals and other household and  
 Kitchen furniture and effects of Catt and the following real Estate to wit tract of land situated  
 in Southampson County containing 156 acres, real or less, and tract of land containing 164 acres,  
 real or less also Island in Southampson County, the first of said tracts of land was owned by  
 said Plaintiff Real by and from Charles Peal and wife and recorded in Southampson County  
 Probate Office the place named by said James Augustus Smith, also recorded at above, and last  
 of said tracts purchased by the hands of Augustus Smith, his son, the Will Test of Dr. E.  
 Examin'd Peal and the lands of Charles Peal did, the tract of land Island to said County containing  
 according to the record of the County known as old Jackson place, that was owned by said James  
 F. Parkinson, A. C. and to said Peal P. G. Miller and others in trust to secure the payment of a sum  
 of money of said Peal for one thousand and fifty dollars due by said Plaintiff Peal to  
 Joseph H. Parkinson at demand and bearing interest at the rate of ten per cent per  
 annum. And it is agreed by the parties to this deed that no sale shall take place by virtue  
 of this deed for the period of twelve months from the date provided the interest on the sum  
 duly secured it being payable once in six months. And it is further agreed that in case  
 of a sale it shall be upon notice or written notice given the lessee to the trustee after  
 24 days public notice of time and place, and upon such terms as said J. F. Parkinson may  
 direct and in such event the trustee shall be entitled to a commission of five percent on gross
