Given Under My Hand

This Deed, made the 12th day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred
and twenty four before Richard U. Burgess of the City of Norfolk of the age of forty
and nine years or thereabouts, and John G. Burgess his son and co-trustee
hereof to trustee of the said City of the other part witnesseth that the said Richard U. Burgess
party of the first part doth grant unto the said John G. Burgess the following premises, to wit
A certain tract of land in the County of Southampton known as Oak Hill, containing the lands
of William C. Vaughan, R. C. Vaughan, and the lands belonging to the estate of Mr. H.
Dimmick and Richard Vaughan it being the same tract of land that day annexed to the
said Richard U. Burgess by Arnold R. Vaughan and Mary T. his wife. In trust to
secure to Arnold R. Vaughan the payment of a sum in the sum of two thousand dollars
current by the said Richard U. Burgess and payable ten years after date. The said note
shall be made bearing and due with the date. But at event of default at the payment of said note above the
time of making the same shall fall due and may be paid by the said John G. Burgess trustee and it is covenanted
and agreed between the parties aforesaid, that in case of a sale the same shall be made after
full advertising the time, place, and terms thereof. On ten days at least before public sale
in the County of Southampton and after the following terms to wit, for each as well as may be
