Davis of the other part Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred (\$800) dollars and the said R. J. Williams and M. A. Williams do grant unto the said Benj. M. Davis, all of the County of Stafford, a tract of land known as the "Swamp" containing by metes and bounds surveyed and legally laid off 173 acres, be the same more or less, - lying in the County of Stafford, and of 173 and bounded as follows, To-wit: the said Commencing at a stopped line on the River of the Gulf of Spain back and S. Williams), runs on westerly corner along said Williams tract to a corner, thence down said line to the head of "Round Hill" swamp, thence down said line to a corner, thence on a 30 degree, more, thence back along said boundary to a corner, then thence west along a head of Clifton back to a corner, then (thence) in old path, thence North back to the "Rolling Hill", thence west along said line to the road, and thence along said road to the point first named.
