

The Agreement made and entered into the 23rd day of April A.D. 1874 between Elias P. Vick
party of the first part and the Long party of the second part, both parties of the County of Charles
and State of Virginia. Whereas the party of the first part owns and agrees to keep
the land No. 101 in parsony of the second part, land sufficient for a one house lot at what is
commonly known as the Whitelaw place, and also agrees to furnish the said party of the
second part supplies for the four part of collecting said farm - to no amount not exceeding one
hundred and fifty dollars, also to furnish tools and forked wood to cultivate the said land
and after paying Mr. J. M. Corlett one of John Whitelaw descendants and James C. Col. as
feeder of the cattle produced at said farm, and the remainder to be equally divided
between the parties of the first and second parts. The party of the second part in consideration
of the above mentioned to be made by the party of the first part, agrees that the said
tack of the first part shall have entire control of all the crops of every kind produced on such
large farm after the rent as mentioned above shall be paid and satisfied - sell or dispose of as
he may desire but until the aforesaid debt by the said Elias Vick shall be fully and entirely
paid. And the party of second part agrees and by these presents do convey and give to the said
Vick his wife and children right to have and to hold, with such advances of one hundred and
fifty dollars shall be full satisfied - signed under my hand and sealed this day and date
first above written -
