This Deed made this 6th day of May A. D. 1874 between Samuel A. Merrill of the one part and W. B. Merrill of the other part, Whereas, that the said Samuel A. Merrill did grant unto the said W. B. Merrill the following property, to wit: One gray blood and black mare, 9 head of cattle 3 dogs, pigs, 4 sheep, 1 buggy, harness, 1 Cart and wheels 1 Hayrack, household articles, furniture and the said Merrill did give of his saddle, shoes, harness &c. promise to be made the present year, and the interest of the said stock and tract to secure the payment of a debt due Robert A. Steph & Walter T. Standen of three hundred & sixteen dollars due 1st day of January 1875. And whereas in writing the place in which the said Merrill now lives it was agreed that should he fail to comply with certain promises made he should forfeit twenty five dollars which amount is included in the said sum of \$316. Two dollars that should the said Merrill fully comply with said promise he is to be credited for the said \$25 in the payment of the said debt. Witness the following signatures and seal.

This Agreement made and entered into this 1st day of May A. D. 1874 between C. N. Barkham of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the first part and E. H. Barkley of the County and State aforesaid of the second part, Whereas, The party of the first part Commands and agrees to put to the party of the second part, a set four hundred and twenty five dollars - And the party of the first part further agrees to furnish supplies to the said party of the second part to enable him to cultivate said farm but cannot not to exceed one hundred and fifty dollars to be furnished in February etc. And all other things necessary to carry on said farm. And the party of the second part in consideration of the premises as aforesaid stated, agrees to cultivate said farm with good horses and four or five hundred and twenty five dollars rent. And the party of the second part further agrees that the rent and supplies as aforesaid stated shall constitute a lien upon all the crops of every kind paid the rent and advances as aforesaid shall be fully and completely paid, and the party of the second part also agrees that the party of the first part shall have full control of all the labor crops or so much as may be necessary to pay said rent and advances. And if necessary a set of public sale he can do so by giving ten days notice. Witness our hands and seals this day and date as above written.
