The Deed of Trust made the 9th day of May 1874 between P. Edwards of the first part, Proprietor of 3000 acres of the民主part, and W. E. Pequignot and Marion of Myricks of the third part, witnesseth that the said James P. Edwards doth grant unto the said P. Edwards 3000 acres of land, with general warranty the following property. To the said Edward Edwards being and her factors, himself, Surety, Head of Hedges and their future increase. For Land and Woods, all his former combination of every kind, Household and Kitchen furniture of every kind. All the Cows, Sheep, Pigs & all kind of fowls, present growing or to come. Also one Cedar tree in his woods should Pequignot Corp. of Cedar, Cedar, Oak and Cypress for payment to himself the following debts due the said W. E. Pequignot and Marion of Myricks One Bond for twenty five dollars and twenty five cents due to W. E. Pequignot dated and due February 21st 1874. One Other Bond for fifty Dollars and eighty five cents due to same, dated and due May 1st 1874 one Bond for one hundred and Twenty Five Dollars due to Marion of Myricks dated and due April 30th 1874. One Cedar Bond executed to James G. Ward and due to Marion of Myricks for eighty five dollars and six cents dated and due January 31st 1874, subject to a credit of Twenty five Dollars and Six cents due to the said Marion of Myricks. And it is hereby covenanted and agreed by and between the parties to this trust that no sale shall take place under this trust without the consent of the said James P. Edwards prior to the first day of June 1874, and that when a sale does take place should ever be necessary it shall be for cash, after giving thirty days notice of the time and place of sale, the proceeds after paying the cost and expenses of the trust, shall be applied to the payment of the above named bond and interest due the said Marion of Myricks the balance if any may prove to the said James P. Edwards or his legal representatives.
