

This Deed made the 22^d day of June Anno Domini 1876, between William C. Pratt of the first part (Grantor), and Daniel H. Corliss (Donee) of the second part, Thiswits: That the said Charles Pratt hereby grant and convey to the said Corliss the following property to wit; one given tract, and four old ones, all granting (built) about twenty five, including two, and they possess the same and divide, plus East-gate, West-gate - his acre, and also other farming implements of every kind, all the house hold and kitchen furniture, of every kind now in the possession of the said Pratt, including his millinery and dress clothes and thread, and quacking gear and apparatuses, chains, cooking and silver ware - the grantor's carpenter's tools - his axes of all kinds, coal, iron, solder, other articles &c. &c. which he deems the foregoing to be the following debts to wit: An old account by and about \$150. dollars due to Daniel Corliss - and account In about \$150 dollars due to Wm. H.C. Bennett - and account by about \$95 dollars due to Alexander Wright - as payment for about \$15 dollars due to John C. Taylor, and balance due to James Matthews of Great-Britain, or account about \$150 dollars. And said Charles Pratt grants and conveys to the said Corliss (Donee) a general judgment claim by and to the Circuit Court of Washington County, of the 1st term, A.D. 1875, for the sum of \$131.00 against Charles Pratt, to be applied to the satisfaction of the above named debt.
