

Whereas H. D. Saunders, a farmer, living in the County of Southampton State of Virginia, is in need of certain supplies of provisions &c. for the making of his crops now growing in the growing season, and Messrs. Henry Edmunds & Sons of Portsmouth Va. and Jas. C. Schell of Southampton County Va. have this day consented and agreed to furnish the said H. D. Saunders with such supplies or advances in money as he may need, not in excess of Two Hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) for the purposes aforesaid, the said H. D. Saunders doth this 15th day of June A. D. 1875, give unto the said Henry Edmunds & Sons of Portsmouth & Jas. C. Schell of his said County of Cecil, Federal, Cotton & Francis to secure the said advances and supplies to be furnished aforesaid, before the date of this agreement and the 1st day of May A. D. 1875, by the said Henry Edmunds & Sons and Jas. C. Schell, in such amounts as the said H. D. Saunders may desire, provided it is provided that in the aggregate they do not exceed Two Hundred and fifty dollars. And it is further agreed that the amount to be furnished by the said James C. Schell shall not exceed ninety dollars. Messrs. Henry Edmunds & Sons agreeing to furnish the balance, that is to say (\$125) One hundred and twenty dollars.

This deed made the 17th day of December in the year 1873, between George W. Holland and Mary his wife, of the first part and Samuel B. Prindle and Mary his wife of the second part, all of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. Witnesseth that in consideration of twenty two acres of land more or less, the said George W. Holland, wife aforesaid unto the said S. B. Prindle a piece of land containing sixteen acres, bounded on the north by the land of S. B. Prindle, on the east by the land of George W. Holland, on the south by land the title of which is disputed by said S. B. Prindle & John W. Cottle, and the east by a large tract running from S. B. Prindle's land to the land adjoining William Cottle's land. Moreover we the said party of the first part doth covenant and agree to and with the said party of the second part, that after the delivery of these presents to warrant generally the right and title of the aforesaid land to him the said S. B. Prindle, his heirs and assigns forever in full and whole, we the said party of the first part have signally set our hands & seals.
