

5th Deed made the 16<sup>th</sup> day of May, A.D. 1874, between John E. Applewhite  
the grantor of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part and John  
H. Harrison, the trustee of the same County and State, of the second part. Whereas it is  
agreed and considered of that dollar and hundred bushels of the first part  
by John H. Harrison the trustee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the 10<sup>th</sup> John  
E. Applewhite did or do grant unto his said trustee a grant and convey unto the said  
John H. Harrison the trustee the sum of money that the Party with he due and account  
of farm I formerly owned, to the thousand dollars and due on January 1<sup>st</sup>, also the  
aforesaid amount due and for want of payment received by John E. Harrison the  
1<sup>st</sup> January 1874, said farm commonly known as the old Seemore place and also my other cape  
of Cotton Card field &c. I may produce this present year 1874, out the farm I now reside on  
called the James Island. I do trust to receive a note due to Mr. R. Butler by said John E. Applewhite  
of one hundred and forty five dollars and forty eight cents, and was dated 1<sup>st</sup> January, 1874, and  
bearing interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum, and also an account for supplies  
and furnishings due to Mr. R. Butler and Walter Bond trading under the firm and style of Mr. W.  
Bonds & Co. of two hundred dollars - and said account due this day. Given under my hand  
and seal this day of May 1874.
