

This Deed made the 16th day of May, A.D. 1874, between John C. Applewhite the grantor of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, of the first part, and John H. Harrison, the Grantee of the same County and State of the second part, Whereas, that by and in consideration of five dollars in hand paid to John C. Applewhite of the first part, by John H. Harrison the Grantee, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said John C. Applewhite did give, grant, and by these presents do grant and convey unto the said John H. Harrison the Grantee the interest amounting that John C. Applewhite will be due and pay out of farm & property situated, viz. Three hundred dollars and two and a half cents, January 1875, also the interest amount due and for each portion of said farm to Benjamin Harrison & Co. Sixty dollars due 1st January 1875, said farm commonly known as the Chat-Thomas place, and also any other crops of Cotton and Tobacco &c. I may produce this present year 1874, and the farm & not residing on called the Davis place, do trust to receive in full of the said John H. Harrison by said John C. Applewhite of one hundred and fifty five dollars and forty eight cents, said note dated 1st January 1874, and having interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum, and also an Agent named for supplies and clothing due to the Grantee and Walter Davis trading under the firm and style of W. M. Davis & Co. of two hundred dollars, and said account due this day - None and any hand and note this day of May 1874.

Butler (Grantee) of the other part, Whereas, that the said Don C. Barnes did grant unto the aforesaid Walter M. Butler (Grantee) the following property, in trust, to and save unto the growing crop of Cotton, field, Cotton, peanuts and household and kitchen furniture & several Rides, & the balance in a city of twenty six dollars and thirty cents (26th 30th) due unto the Grantee with interest, the condition of the deed are as follows, should the aforesaid note and interest be paid on or before the 1st day of August 1874, then the debt to be null and void, otherwise the aforesaid Walter M. Butler Grantee after giving timely notice of default by advertisement, proceed to sell the aforesaid property on his premises for cash, first pay all legal charges attending the sale, then pay the aforesaid note and interest, the balance of any, pay over to the aforesaid Don C. Barnes or his legal representative.
