

Whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton, returned at the July Term, 1874, in the Chancery suit of S. Pepl v. Story et al., it was ordered that Joseph S. Pepl, et al. plaintiff, recover a deed with several warranty to R. P. Pepl, conveying in said deed a tract of land purchased by said R. P. Pepl of C.R. Story in his lifetime, and for which said Pepl did not receive a deed from said Story in his lifetime, and whereas the said Pepl has fully paid all the purchase money for said tract of land, as will be seen by reference to the Chancery papers in the above styled suit, and whereas Mollie T. Story, the wife of said C.R. Story, die^s is willing to hazard a party to this deed, as is evidenced by her signing and sealing this deed, C.R. Story, therefore the date makes the 15th day of March 1874, before J. D. Palmer, Commissioner as aforesaid, and Mollie T. Story, parties of the first; R. P. Pepl of the second part, witnesseth, that in consideration of the above premises and the sum of two thousand dollars that has been fully paid by the said R. P. Pepl, before the execution of this deed, by the said J. D. Palmer Commissioner as aforesaid, and the said Mollie T. Story do grant and convey unto the said R. P. Pepl, to him and his heirs forever, the following tract of land, to wit: a certain parcel of land situated in Southampton County, containing 45^{1/2} acres, as the same now or hereafter bounded by the land of Mr. George W. Caswell, Norville, etc., John Brown, Henry Lester, James Congdon, Thomas & John Pepl, the same being tract of land purchased of C.R. Story by said R. P. Pepl, at the lifetime of said Story. And the said J. D. Palmer, Commissioner as aforesaid, warrants specially, and the said Mollie T. Story warrants generally, that perfectly hereby conveys. Witness the following signatures and seals.
