first part in consideration of the sum of One hundred
dollar in hand paid to the said Charles Buley by the party of the second part the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged he has given granted, bargained and sold and by these presents
do grant, bargained and sell with general warranty unto the said E. E. Whittlehurst, party of
the second part his heirs &c. all that certain tract of land lying and being in the County
of Southampton in the State of Virginia bounded as to William Street and bounded with
tracts by the lands belonging to the estate of the late James D. Merchant in the east
by the John H. Pittman tract belonging to James D. Merchant and the lands east and back
by the lands of Nathaniel Powell and on the west by the line of Pittman's Street, all
containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less siting the aforesaid tract of land which was
conveyed to the said Charles Buley by Southampton City by deed dated the 26th day of
March A.D. 1863 and of record in the office of the County Court of Southampton County

for the rest of the number of the inhabitants present, shall be entitled to make a church and

narrowly along said First Avenue one hundred and five feet along Southampton to
