Phil Dead made the 16th day of July in the year 1834, between Martha Hester
Mother Adeline Hester, Emma Hester, Maria Hester & All and Monika his wife and John H. Scott as
Sons & his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Esq.
John H. Scott of said County and State of the second part. Whereas by a decree of the Circuit
Court of Southampton County, on the said term 1834, J. H. Scott was appointed a trust
Commissioner to invent the fund remaining in his hands as administrator of William Hester deceased
Esq. H. H. Griffin for & after paying the costs and a certain debt mentioned in such decree, in a Bond secured by
Hester Oct 2nd 1833 paid of bonds or whenambers Real estate, and whenever the said J. Scott is possessed of
said decree, on the 16th day of July 1834 invented the sum of Two hundred and forty dollars
dol^rs balanced remaining in his hands by a sum of said sum to Martha Hester, Emma

and the sum of five dollars to have in hand paid to receipt thereof a bond aforesaid

in the County of Southampton Virginia and described as follows viz: The first tract is

containing forty acres and bounded by the lands of Samuel Bowditch, Charles George Camp
H. H. Scott, and the lands belonging to the estate of Jacob Compton deceased
The third tract containing one hundred and sixteen acres and bounded by the
lands of Charles Hester, Jacob Story, Thomas Bowditch, Charles George Camp and others. It has also
