This Deed of Trust made the 27th day of July 18th 1870 between Abraham H. Henshaw of the first part and Mrs. A. Merrill of the second part. Witness that the said party of the first part did grant and convey unto the said party of the second part, the following property, to wit: for Granting, Capt. of Corn, fiddler, Actor and pianist on the place upon which sit now vacant, adjoining to the lot of S. D. & R. K. regarding the trust however, to remain the payment of the following note to wit: One Bond due Dec. 3. Henshaw for forty dollars (\$40.00) due Dec. 25th 1871 and one Bond due Dec. R. Chambliss for forty dollars (\$40.00) due Dec. 25th 1871 both bearing int. four doll and cents due 18th 1872.
