Sp't. That on or abt the 1st day of January in the year 1774 between J. N. Peltier and Henry J. N. his wife, and J. D. Smith and Mary J. his wife of the County of Washington and State of Virginia the first part and John Peltier of said County and State of the second part. They first did make in consideration of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to them in hand paid by the said John Peltier of said County and State of Virginia acknowledged, that the said J. N. Peltier and Mary J. N. his wife, and J. D. Smith and Mary J. his wife, to grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John Peltier of said County, all their interest and claim in and to certain land or share of the tract of land herein conveyed, it and to be divided into lots of land lying in the County of Washington Virginia, containing by estimation forty three acres of land more or less and bounded by a line commencing at the upper corner of William C. Powell's land on the Southern and South-East-Corner, read thus: Southwardly along the said Powell's line to the Southern boundary of said Powell's Co. thence eastwardly along said Southern boundary to North Adams line thence Southwardly along the said Adams line and Northern boundary of North Adams line to the fourth corner thence easterly along the line of said Powell's land thence along Powell's line to the Southern and South-East-Corner, thence easterly along the line of said Powell's land running easterly to the line of the Southern and South-East-Corner, read thus: Southwardly along the said line of Powell's line to the opposite end, thence easterly along said Powell's line to the point of beginning, and the said parties of the first part conveyed unto the said John Peltier
