

The Deed made this 20th day of July in the year 1874 between C. C. Vaughan, Executor, of the first part, and James H. Sawmire and Virginia his wife, of the second part, and John S. McWhorter, of the third part, all of the State of Virginia, Whereas by virtue of a deed of trust bearing date on the 20th day of April 1874, made by William DeRosier and Maria his wife conveying to C. C. Vaughan trustee, all their right, title and interest in and to a certain lot of land lying in the village of Soperfield, for the benefit of Joseph Gregory, the said C. C. Vaughan, as trustee, did after due publication of time and notice of sale, sell at public auction on the 20th day of July 1874, all of the right, title and interest of the said DeRosier and wife in and to the said lot of land conveyed to him by the aforesaid And of course, and whereas the said J. S. McWhorter party of the third part, being making the highest bid for the said lot of land in or for the interest of the said DeRosier and wife above, to wit, the sum of six hundred and eleven dollars, and whereas the said James H. Sawmire and Virginia his wife, before the sale of all of their interest and claim in and to the lot of land aforesaid, to the said John S. McWhorter for the sum of three hundred dollars. Therefore, Whereas: And for in consideration of the said sum of money to wit, the sum of two hundred and eleven dollars to the said James H. Sawmire and Virginia his wife, the said party of the third part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they, the said parties of the first and second parts, do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the third part all that certain lot of land, (mentioned above) lying in the village of Soperfield, and bounded by a line beginning at said street at the Western Corner of Charles Smith's lot, thence Northwesterly along main street about 53 1/2 feet to the lot belonging to the J. R. Reed and thence easterly, by along the line of the said Railroad lot about 200 feet to the lands of Mr. M. E. Dorman, thence southerly, southerly along the Dorman line about 53 1/2 feet to Charles Smith's lot, thence easterly along the line of the said Smith's lot to main street the point of beginning, And to right is hereby conveyed to the said party of the third part to interfere with or obstruct the branch street of the J. and K. Railroads running through said lot. And the said Sawmire and wife accepting the above premises of the J. R. Railroad, Whereas: Therefore the title to the aforesaid lot of land, and the said C. C. Vaughan, executor, the same specially, Witness the following signatures and seals the day and year above written.
