This Deed of Gift made this 1st day of September 1874 between Charles A. Pease party of the first part, Joseph A. Stinson trustee of the second part and the 3<sup>rd</sup> party of the land just witnessed, that in consideration of the sum of five dollars in hand paid, and the premises hereinbefore mentioned, the said said party of the first part to grant and convey with general warranty to the said J. A. Stinson, trustee, to his heirs and assigns the following real and personal estate, all in the County of Southampton - to wit a tract of land upon which the said party of the first part now lies containing 300 ac. but the same more or less, and being the tract of land whereof Ned Pease died single holding the land H. R. Pease, Eliza Pease, Estella A. S. Pease and Ben Knight also the two said parties of first part own in the estate of Eliza Pease etc; also the following personalty to wit six horses, eight cows and their increase, stock of hogs and other animals, farm implements of every description, carts, wagons &c. houses held and kitchen furniture, tools, traps and other property to be agreed while the deed remains unsatisfied. It is further agreed to record the payment of a sum of two dollars with this deed for this record fee paid at demand and due the 1st of October by the said parties of the first part to it is agreed by the parties to this deed that should any of the personal property be exchanged for other property, that the law of the land shall attach to the property so for.
