

This Will made this 28th day of May 1874, between John H. Jordan of Southampton County, Virginia, of the first part; and W. P. Scott, Executor, of County and State aforesaid, of the second part, Witnessed that the said John H. Jordan of County and State aforesaid, and party of the first part, did grant and convey unto the said W. P. Scott, Executor, and party of the second part, but under copy of Will signed and the hands, names and seal of said; and belonging to said W. P. Scott, to receive a debt due to and from the County by party and other accounts, and amounting to (\$2000⁰⁰) Two thousand dollars. It being agreed, the party of the first part, has received at his hands and affixed his seal, this 28th day of May 1874.

Whereas John P. Boykin and his wife by their deed of trust, dated the 25th day of January 1874, did intend to convey to John R. Nelly, or to the legal heirs of said thousand dollars, County, into William Nelly, the trustee thereof named, the following property, to wit: a tract of land in the County of Southampton Virginia containing by estimation five hundred and thirty eight acres, more or less, adjoining the lands of the Branch, Collins, Whitham, Patrick Nelly, and the Branch Swamp; also the following chattel estate to wit: all his household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils, and horses, cattle, hogs and stock of all kinds, and interest thereof, and all crops of corn, wheat, rye, oats and potatoes - and himself his said land of survey and all interest therein have been paid. Therefore that did make this 25th day of October 1874, between the said William Nelly, trustee as aforesaid, of the one part, and the said John P. Boykin of the other part, Witnessed that the said William Nelly, trustee as aforesaid, (by and with the consent and direction of the said John R. Nelly, signified by his being a party hereto), did receive and release, unto the said John P. Boykin and to his heirs and assigns forever, the land aforesaid and its appurtenances, and the personal property aforesaid.
