Whereas John P. Nickelson is justly indebted to Margarita G. Nickelson his wife in  
various sum of money, both by bond and open account amounting on this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1874  
to the sum of \$10,750, and whereas the said John P. Nickelson finds himself unable readily to pay  
the debt without making sale of his property, the Plaintiff in this Deed made this 15<sup>th</sup> day  
of November 1874, witness John P. Nickelson of the age of forty and Margarita G. Nickelson of  
the same, both of the County of Sussex and State of Delaware, heretofore, heretofore, her  
in consideration of the premises, \$250 of the full and entire amount of the debt due to the said  
Margarita G. Nickelson, by the said John P. Nickelson, as well as for the general consideration  
of his debts in hand to the said John P. Nickelson by the said Margarita G. Nickelson  
paid as or before the rendering and delivery of these presents (the receipt of which is hereby  
acknowledged) to the said John P. Nickelson debt granted, with general warranty, unto the said  
Margarita G. Nickelson the following property to wit: one certain tract of land  
lying and being in the County of New Castle bounded by the lands of David C. Price, on the  
south, W. H. Dawson on the west, St. C. Clancy Esq. on the north and D. G. Clark  
on the east, and containing 192 1/2 acres more or less, with the improvements thereon, one male, &  
household and kitchen furniture belonging to said John P. Nickelson, all his money  
instruments, cash, wages, plates &c. his stock of hogs, all his Cots of any kind of  
the present year, sheep, two cows, and rife, silver watch, clock, Carpenter tools, and all the  
property owned by the said John P. Nickelson, which herein are mentioned or not, I being the trustee  
to convey to the said Margarita, all the estate, both real and personal, now or hereafter  
belonging to the said John P. Nickelson, to said real estate however being subject to a debt of trust incurred  
by the said John P. Nickelson for the sum of \$1000, with the accrued interest thereon, and due to Virginia  
P. Nickelson, which shall be recovered in the Clerk's Office of South-Capitol County, Conn.
