

This Deed made the 19th day of November 1874 before Margaret G. Richardson & Robert P. Almond of this our best, and Peter P. Almond of the other party, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, testifies: That we, the said Margaret G. Richardson, for and in Consideration of the valuable love and affection which she has for Robert P. Almond, Archdeacon of Southampton (Liber), and for the children of her said soul, as well as for the further valuable Consideration of his consent, to the said Margaret G. Richardson to have and by the said party of the second party, Robert P. Almond whereof it being acknowledged, etc. do make unto the said Robert P. Almond the following property, to wit, all our Real or personal estate lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, containing 182 1/2 acres to it more or less, being the same tract of land purchased by the said Margaret G. Richardson from the said Sam'l R. Richardson, by deed bearing date on the 15th day of November 1874, to which reference is here made, for a more particular description of the said land, as to its boundaries, which date is recorded in the Clerk's Office of Surry and Southampton County Courts. And 2^o All that personal property, consisting, in said tract by Sam'l R. Richardson to be sold, Margaret G. Richardson, consisting of our said all the household and kitchen furniture of that time belonging to the said Sam'l R. Richardson, all his farming implements, carts, wagons, ploughs &c. all his stock of hens, all his flocks of very fine, (the growth of 1874), two Geese, and Pigeons, silver utensils, Clock, Carpenter tools, and all other property owned by the said Sam'l R. Richardson at that time, and conveyed to the said Margaret G. Richardson. In Trust nevertheless, for the use and purpose, and with all conditions and restrictions herinafter mentioned, for the sole use and benefit of the said Margaret G. Richardson (the wife of the said Sam'l R. Richardson), and their children or such as may hereafter be born to them during their joint lives, first from the lifetime of Sam'l R. Richardson, and from any and all liability for his debt or obligation, whether contingent, or born of his executors, and upon that further trust and condition, that Sam'l R. Richardson, his wife, or such other as may be substituted for her, shall retain the title to, and control of, the said property so long as the said Sam'l R. Richardson and his said wife shall live, and in case of the death of the said Sam'l R. Richardson wife of the said Sam'l R. Richardson, before her death, that the said Sam'l R. Richardson shall continue for the sole and certain use and benefit of the children of the said Sam'l R. Richardson and his said wife. But if the said Sam'l R. Richardson should die prior to the death of the said wife, that the said trust shall continue for the use of the said Margaret G. Richardson and her children, so long as she remains his widow, and as her health, evenings, third for the exclusive use and benefit of her children and the sum of such of them as may have died since the creation of this trust. And if it furthermore needs a condition of this trust, that should it become necessary, at any future time to sell the real estate herein named, that the same may be done only by the consent and writing of the said Margaret G. Richardson, if she be living, even in case of her death, then, only, by cause of the bankruptcy of the said Sam'l R. Richardson, who may be dead, together with that of his trustee, who will have to write up the debt and also a power of appointment to any person carrying the interests of the minor children, if any.
