Williams, do hereby grant and convey unto General Company, to the said Samuel D. Gardner trustee, to him and his heirs, the following real estate, to wit, All of a certain tract or parcel of land lying in Personas Road, situated in the County of Gloucester containing 777 acres, the same more or less, bounded east adjoining the lands of A. S. Pepe, A. S. Pepe, the heir of Simon Pepe and Paul E. Pepe, deceased, and others, the same being the tract sold or granted to the said General Company by said Williams, in 1870, and further to secure the payment of a debt due Paul E.
