This Deed made this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1874 between J and Susan Grantor of the 1<sup>st</sup> part and J. C. Stenell Clerk as trustee for the 2<sup>nd</sup> part, of the 1<sup>st</sup> part of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. That the said Jacob Brown doth grant and convey lawfully unto the said J. C. Stenell the following property to wit, a certain parcel or tract of land lying just the opposite County of Southampton State of Virginia containing about twenty acres more or less, on the North side of the creek leading from South Creek to the river, commencing at the Center of the Cedar Swamp and running from thence along the said County road to the bottom of the stream, thence down the stream, thence down the said County road to the said Cedar Swamp, and thence down said Swamp to the beginning of the 1<sup>st</sup> part sold by the said Jacob Brown and formerly owned by Abram L. Gardner deceased, and being the same tract or parcel of land sold by said Jacob Brown to Joseph Brown of Tennessee and sold and conveyed by said Joseph Brown to him the said Jacob Brown. This deed being recorded in the Clerk's Office of said County of Southampton, said lands conveyed in trust to name the following debt to wit: One note of One hundred and thirty seven dollars dated December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1874, and due H. Miller, and the said Jacob Brown hereby declares his right to convey the above said land, and pledges himself to make any conveyance which may be necessary to carry out said purpose and perfect title. This Deed made this seventh day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty four between J. B. Porters of the first part, and Morris Johnson of the second part, of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. That the said J. B. Porters doth grant and convey lawfully unto the said Morris Johnson with general warranty, all the right title and interest, to a certain piece of land supposed to contain by survey twenty two and a half acres, being a part of a tract of land purchased by J.
