

I now shew that A.D. Ingham, Trustee &c. hath received the funds in his hands as said Trustee, as may be appearing by the book of Land in the preceding sections, and whereas further the said book of Land is not now returned by the said A. D. Ingham, as an instrument of the same, before attested to, Now therefore the Court made this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May 1772 Edward Cole, S. Morgan and Davette Richard Morgan his wife of the first part, and A. D. Ingham, Trustee of the second part, respectively in consideration of the several promises, and the sum of Twelve hundred dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey to the said A.D. Ingham, Trustee as aforesaid, in trust of lowlands in Southampton County, Commonly known as Kibrick, and containing 262 3/4 acres, by the same name as is bounded by the lands of Wm. H. Mallow, Thos. H. Sprain Esq. and others, to have and to hold the said tract of land unto the said Trustee, his heirs and assigns, upon trust, That the said Davette shall permit Eliza H. his wife, and their children, to occupy, possess and enjoy the said tract of land, free from all manner of charge and incumbrance of the said A. D. Ingham, her husband, or any husband she may hereafter take, and upon the further trust, that when the said Eliza H. Ingham shall die, then that the said tract of land shall be sold for the use and benefit of the children of the said A.D. Ingham, and first wife, or any wife he may hereafter take. And further the said trust, that the said A.D. Ingham shall be bound to remain upon and occupy the said tract of land, so long as he shall live. And upon this further trust, that the profits of a crop ground upon said tract of land, shall in no wise be subject to the debt of the said A.D. Ingham, except so far as contracted for the maintenance and support of his family. And also said Morgan for himself, and for each and every of his wife, covenants with the said Trustee that he will warrant and defend the title to the above conveyed property against the claims of himself and all other persons whatsoever.
