George St. Johnson of said County and State of the second part, witness: Whereas said George  
did sign and possess a tract of land lying in the County and State aforesaid, leaving long  
St. Johnson and Mrs. E. Johnson his wife at law, and whereas she said George St. Johnson and  
William E. Johnson being desirous to divide said land by a Deed of Partition, therefore in  
consideration of the premises and also in consideration of a deed received by the said George St.  
Johnson conveying to her said William E. Johnson all his right, title and interest in and to a  
certain portion of the said St. Johnson tract of land hereinbefore described. So said William E.  
Johnson and Alice his wife do grant and convey unto the said George St. Johnson all his right,  
title and interest in and to that portion of the said St. Johnson tract lying east of the Berlin and  
Juni County road and bounded by a line beginning at said road at William H. Bowditch line  
South Eastward along said Berlin County road to E. W. Compton's line, thence Southwardly along  
said Compton's line to a corner to the said St. Bowditch line, thence Southwardly along the said  
Bowditch line to a maple a few rods from the said St. Johnson's line, thence Southwardly along  
the said road line of Bowditch line to a black tree on said line, thence Southwardly along  
the said road line of Bowditch line to a pine, a corner tree on said line, thence a little west  
of that along said line of Bowditch line to a pine, a corner tree on said line, thence Southwardly  
along said line to the County road, the point of beginning. Containing one hundred and six  
acres of land more or less. And he said Mr. C. Johnson and Alice his wife warrant generally  
the land above described. And the said George St. Johnson for and in consideration of the  
conveyance to him of the above described piece of land, doth grant and convey unto the said  
William E. Johnson all of his right, title and interest in and to that portion of the said St. St.  
Johnson tract of land lying on the north of said St. Bowditch land and bounded by a line  
beginning at a maple within said Bowditch line thence Southwardly along a nearly straight line  
for the said St. St. and Mr. E. Johnson to a maple a corner for this line, thence Southwardly along  
a line of Bowditch line to a black pine a corner with the same, thence a little west of that along  
a line of Bowditch line to a pine, a corner tree this line, thence a little west of that to a pine,  
a corner tree on this line, thence a little south of that to a pine, a corner of this line, thence  
Southwardly to a black pine in James J. Bowditch line, thence Eastwardly along the said
