

This Deed made the 15th day of January 1875, between James A. Carter, owner of the first part and James W. Carter, son of the second part, of Westfield, that the subscriber, J. Carter, do hereby grant unto the said James A. Carter, his wife, Mary Ann, and their son, George W. Carter, and his wife, Mary Ann, the following property, to wit: One long house, (dwelling) and two lots (lot & yard), five acres of land, fifteen bushels of hay, two carts and wheels and one spring wagon, forming implements, necessary fitted to the above land, as thirty bushels of corn, and chairman, formula table, books or board, some personal furniture, and also my entire household and Westfield furniture. In trust to secure the payment of the following notes to wh. and note due G. W. Carter, for the sum of twenty five dollars, signed by the said Carter and dated the 15th of January 1875, and note due George W. Whitfield, for the sum of twenty five dollars, signed by the said Carter and dated the 15th of January 1875. But if it should become necessary to sell the above named property for the payment of the above and notes, the said trustee shall give at least ten days notice of the time and place of such sale and shall sell same to the highest bidder for cash and after paying all expenses attending the execution of the sale, and shall take account with the interest accrued according to the usual and common law of the state and notes and the example of any note to the said J. Carter, his executors or administrators.
