Whereas, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars, of which he hereby acknowledgeeth has given, granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and doth hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said party of the second, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land lying within the County of Southampton State of Virginia, bounded as follows, viz.: Beginning at a corner of the same at the State line, up the said line to R. H. Harts line, thence along North G. Hollands line to the said line, then up the said line to the said State line bounded by the lands of Henry M. Brice and down the State line North Hart's line to the first gap of H. Hollands and S. Brice and S.
