By weight whereof is hereby acknowledged, have examined and tested by said persons as good and sufficient
the said party of the second part the following property to wit 2 bushels peanuts, 2 bushels corn, 2 ears
of Indian corn, 2 pease, 2 beans, as need, doth to have and to hold all and singular the goods and chattels
afore mentioned, sold or intreated to be with the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever.
And I the said party of the first party will with forever defend the above mentioned goods and chattels
and the party of the second party against the following conditions, that if I the said party of the first party
died and the body part of the said party of the second party die him and and his law children after
the first day of January next, said death warrants shall be void. And I the said party of the first party do
convene and agree with the party of the second party, that in case of death shall be made in the
payment of the sum of money above mentioned, how it shall be law full for the party of the second party
to enter my premises and take and carry away the above mentioned goods and chattels and sell for the best
price he can obtain and out of the money arising therefrom pay the above mentioned sum of money rendering
no overplus in case under or over my administrators or assigns, and until default shall be made in the
payment of the said sum of money I am to remain in the quiet possession of the aforesaid Goods and
Chattels and in the full and free enjoyment of the same. In witness whereof I the party of the first
part have counterset my hand and seal the 10th day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
