This 20th month and year and entered into the 20th day of January 1875 before I, Briles Lewis, Notary of the 1st parish and District B. Prince, Queen of the 1st Ward, Southampton, Plaintiff by his last will and Testament fully proved and admitted to record in the County Court of Southampton on the 21st of August 1874 did give full power to his executor Thomas Lewis to sell all his real and personal estate for the payment of his debts, and expenses thereof to Charles and Thomas D. Gray, his executors herein named, so to conduct his estate as such and whomsoever Thomas D. Gray see qualified as a trustee of his deceased Master's estate as he will command and did acting under the power granted or has by the said will sell all debts to J. S. Briles and the real estate of the said deceased Plaintiff for the sum of five thousand four hundred dollars of Current Credit to Joseph B. Prince and whom he succeeds in the place he paid all the sum of five thousand four hundred dollars and all due interest thereon according to the said Plaintiff's Deed from his right wherof is fully accounted before these witness for the debt aforesaid that is consideration of the premises, the said Thomas D. Gray sum of five thousand four hundred dollars and the said Plaintiff's heirs, executors, administrators and sold unto Joseph B. Prince a certain tract of land lying in Southampton County known as Brilesland bounded eastward containing two hundred and more or less, the said tract being all the land owned by Plaintiff Plaintiff (except the land sold by Plaintiff to E. J. Gardner) bounded at follows: East by the lands of Thomas J. Miller and E. J. Gardner, East by the lands of Plaintiff, Briles Lewis and A. G. Peeler, South by the lands of John S. Briles and others not yet set on the Potowmack river and the said Plaintiff, Briles Lewis did acknowledge and agree with the said Joseph B. Prince that he will convey and defend to him such title and right as was vested in him by the last will and testament of Plaintiff Plaintiff doth now make.
