Mr. D. Miller made his 15th day of January 1875, returned John H. Pennell of the one part and G. Congress of the other part, witnesseth, that he said John H. Pennell for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and five hundred dollars paid by the said John H. Pennell, and before the sealing and delivery of said sum, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he said John H. Pennell did grant and convey a certain acre or more and G. Congress did receive a triangular piece or parcel of land containing two acres more or less bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a large branch pine tree, the root of the said branch is near the head of John Pennell's Estate, the said John H. Pennell and G. Congress, always in a Westerly course along the head of the said John H. Pennell's and G. Congress' land, sixty yards to where the line between said course, thence in a Southwesterly course along the line of said Pennell's and Congress' land to a small black pine tree the end of the Creek Branch, thence in a Northeasternly course along the end of said Creek Branch to the beginning.
