This Ord. made this 9th day of February in the year 1775 Between James J. Doreland of the
one part and Samuel Dargum of the other part. Whereas that whereas the said Samuel Dargum and
Heirs of T. his wife did by their last bearing date wth the 25th day of February 1770 grant of Doreland in the
Clerk's office of the County Court of Southampton County every unto the said J. Doreland with full power
wholly the following property to wit: the tract of land and premises on which the said Samuel
Dargum and heirs, consisting by estimation for hundreds and twenty acres, to wit: one and seven a 1/2
and adjoining the lands of Benjamin Powell; Benjamin Griffin; Delle Powell; Ludwige Powell; the heirs
of Martha Wick and David, also two more, one 1/2 of acre; thirty heads of cattle; fourteen head of
hogs; and they paid the future interest of all said stock, four cents and what with all other forming
improvements, household and kitchen furniture, in trust to secure the following debts, one hundred and twenty
C. for one thousand twenty eight dollars and ninety five cents and demands and bearing date
with the said Doreland, and bond due James D. Williams for eighty four 2/3s Dollars, carried the 20th
day of January 1765 and one other bond due James for one hundred and sixty and 2/3s Dollars,
carried the 15th day of February 1769. And the said Samuel Dargum having fully paid and
satisfied the several debts secured by the bond of trust aforesaid, do hereby certify that the property aforesaid
being to now remain to him. Now therefore this Doreland for his full knowledge that the said J. Doreland
do hereby trustee as aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises debt by these presents recovery with
special Privilege to the said Samuel Dargum, all and every part and parcel of the property aforesaid,
to hold by the said of trust above recited, and release the said property, from all or any claim or
demand that or law, excepted therein by the bond of trust aforesaid. And the said Benjamin C. Doreland
do hereby acknowledge the property aforesaid, in full of the debt secured by bond by the said bond of trust, by
