Carham on his crops which may be made during the year 1875 upon the lands of which the said Whitley certifies for the above outfit of advance which has been or was intended to have been advanced, this limit is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1875, entitled and got to record a document for agricultural purposes. This Deed made this 11th day of February 1875 between William M. Reynolds of one part and John C. Drake of party, Witness as follows that whereas the said John C. Drake and his wife Elizabeth his wife died on the 5th day of March 1874 leaving to the said William M. Reynolds one tract or parcel of land adjoining each other situated in the County of Southampton State of Virginia bounded by the State line, the land formally owned by Elizabeth Drake the land of Richard George Drake and Reynolds and William C. Reynolds and north towards the Pennsylvania bank containing eighty five acres the other tract containing one hundred and forty six acres formally owned by Mary Reynolds late George's wife and her father's estate. Now with one and above future income and the two tracts and their several and several and heretofore to receive the payment of the following bonds and date out the 5th day of March 1875 for one hundred and sixteen dollars twenty five cents and give one for twenty dollars and sixty cents and do this 5th day of March 1875 to William M. Reynolds and whereas the said John C. Drake having fully paid one note for the said debt desires that the deed of trust aforesaid be released and the property therein conveyed be remoyed
