The Deed made the 26th day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and
forty five between J. D. Pirtle and Henry J. D. Davis his wife of the first part, and John D.
Pirtle of the second part; Whereas, both in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars, the
said J. D. Pirtle and Henry J. D. Pirtle do grant unto the said J. D. Davis with general
covenants all the land bounded West of that portion of the Andrew Dick land which and purchased
by J. D. Pirtle and at which he said J. D. Davis resides; bounded as follows, on the
East by the road running by Father Tidts to the Black Creek road on the South by a line
running parallel with the lands of Edward J. Cobbs and nearly just from it and ending
