

The Deed of Trust made this 27th day of February 1775, between John C. Miller of said parish, J. D. Wright Deputed of second party, et. J. D. Wright Deputed of third party, that in consideration of Five hundred dollars, the said parties of the first part do grant and convey with several exceptions to the said J. D. Wright Deputed the following estate to wit: One tract due on land all of my farming implements, Cattle and sheep, Household and Kitchen furniture, with stock of every kind, and all the Cattle and fodder at hand, to trust to secure the payment of a debt due to J. D. Miller by said John C. Miller by bond for Five hundred dollars given January 1st 1775. Witness the following signature and Seal.

The Deed of Trust from John C. Miller to J. D. Wright Deputed for the benefit of A. J. Pope was this day received and acknowledged by said Miller to be his act and deed, and admitted to record.

The Deed made this 26th day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty four, between J. D. Miller and Henry J. D. Miller by wife of the first part, and John C. Miller of the second part, that in consideration of five hundred dollars, the said J. D. Miller and Henry J. D. Miller do grant unto the said John C. Miller, with several exceptions, that part of the Andrew's Tract of land, in which he (John C. Miller) now resides and supposed to contain one hundred and sixty one acres more or less, and bounded on the North by the land of Henry J. D. Miller, on the East by the land of John C. Miller, on the South by the land of J. D. Miller and William Davis and John, by the land of the said J. D. Miller and Henry J. D. Miller, to wit: That they have the right to convey the said land to the Grantee, that they have done so, act to incumber the said lands, that the Grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, free from all incumbrances, and J. D. Miller and Henry J. D. Miller, parties of the first part, will execute such further approval of the said land as may be requisite.
