This 2nd 1773 was and returned into this 29th day of December in year 1773 between Benjamin
P. Applewhite and Emily P. Applewhite his wife Benjamin C. Howell and I, John G. Edwards
of the first part and Richard H. Nicholsel widow of David H. Nicholsel and Mrs. J. Nicholsel
child of David H. Nicholsel and Emily P. Nicholsel his first infant child genetic of the second part,
whereas I, the Circuit Court of Guadalupe did at its October term 1773 decree that against R. Taylor
without certain bonds from the Clerk's Office in the case of Nicholsel vs. Nicholsel &c. amounting
to the sum of £100.00 the same and interest and collect the same and payables as heretofore for the sum
of David H. Nicholsel's widow and children's debts. And whereas the said Benjamin P. Applewhite
and Emily P. his wife have this day sold to the said James R. Taylor a certain tract of land in
Guadalupe containing two hundred and forty four acres for the sum of one hundred and nine
dollars (\$99) in full tract of land he said James R. Applewhite has given a deed of trust
to J. Howell as trustee to secure a debt for four hundred, and sixteen dollars due to Benjamin
C. Howell and whereas he said Howell and Howell have given their counters to this sale made
by their executors the deed which it does appear in full of the said deed of trust to the said
Applewhite and wife. Now therefore just deed I, John G. Edwards, that for and in consideration of the
sum of nine hundred and nine dollars, he and Benjamin P. Applewhite, Emily P. Applewhite
& J. Howell and Benjamin C. Howell of grants and Morgan and sell unto Richard H.
Nicholsel widow and David H. Nicholsel child of David H. Nicholsel and Mrs. J. Nicholsel
Nicholsel and Samuel Nicholsel the widow and first infant child of David H. Nicholsel
the a certain tract of land lying in Guadalupe County containing two hundred and forty four
acres more or less bounded by the lands of James R. Howell and Benjamin C. Howell and others
as follows and it is further said said tract of two hundred and forty four acres as a heretofore
under the act approved the 27th of June 1770 and the said Benjamin P. Applewhite and
Emily P. Applewhite his wife being warned the title to the said tract of land to the parties

came P. Applewhite his wife Emily P. Applewhite whose names are signed to the writing
above bearing date the 29th day of December 1773 personally appeared before me in the County
Court, and being examined by me privately and apart from her husband and having the writing
before fully explained to her she said Emily P. Applewhite acknowledged the said writing
to be her act and declared that she had willingly executed the same and did not wish to recant
it.
