Hicklin shall be and he is hereby invested with all the rights, privileges and duties and subject to the same responsibilities, that are intended to be conveyed to, and conferred upon the said Almond, by the deed of November 19th 1872, to which reference has been made so frequently made.

Hicklin, Deed of the second part of the County of Southampton, Virginia, That is to say, that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars in hand paid by the party of the second part, the party of the first part, who is herein acknowledged, the party of the first part, with all, grant and convey to the party of the second part with general warranty the following real estate, being in Southampton County, Virginia, One tract or parcel of land containing a tract of land containing no less than 100 acres, commencing at the south side of Vicki Creek (now Dickey) and extending west along side of Vicki Creek, and back to the County road to a small branch of Vicki Creek, and being sufficient to supply twenty cows by survey.
