Witnessed by Deed of Deed from Augustus Crompler to J. A. Prince Trustee, dated July
27th 1774, and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Gloucester County, the said Crompler County, I, Captain
and personal property to said J. A. Prince Trustee to secure the payment of a sum for
one thousand dollars, due by said Crompler to C. C. Whitfield, and whereas the said debt has
been fully satisfied, as is evidenced by the said C. C. Whitfield being a party to the deed,
signing and sealing the same, and whereas said Crompler is now entitled to remission any of
the said real and personal estate, now from the time of the aforesaid deed of July 27th 1774,
you therefore this deed made this 15th day of March 1775 between C. C. Whitfield and
J. A. Prince Trustee of one party and Aug. Crompler of the other party Testifying that
in Consideration of the above premises the said parties of the first part do grant and convey
to said Crompler all the estate real and personal, granted in said deed of July 27th

part, all of Gloucester County Va. Testifying that the said parties of the first part
do grant and convey unto the said parties of the second part the following property to wit:

the lands of C. C. Whitfield situated in Gloucester County known as the "Swiney Branch" adjoining
the lands of C. C. Whitfield and the lands of C. C. Whitfield and bounded on the East by the
Wolney River, supposed to contain 198 acres, more or less. In trust, however to
secure the payment of a certain land due N. Edwards C. C. Whitfield for two hundred
and ten dollars (\$200.00) with interest from February 28th 1775 till paid.
