This Deed was made the first (1st) day of August in the year One thousand eight
hundred and seventy, between George E. Brister and wife William H. Brister his esp.
and John H. Harrison of the County of Franklin in the State of Virginia, of the first
part, and Charles Brister of the second party, deceased. That the said parties of the
first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Five hundred (\$500) dollars,

lawful money of the United States of America, to have in hand ready to be in
party of the second part, as and before the retaking and delivery of said friends to
occupy whom it truly appears belongs, but abandoned, despised, sold, alienated
abused, embezzled and defrauded, and by their present less friends, having all
also omitted, absent, away and confined unto the said party of the second part

and to his heart and affections forever, all of such pieces of land, running from
a stream called Long Creek down along the County road leading from the City
of New Bern to Franklin, N.C., to a small stream called Little Black Creek, same
named there two thousand, to where they unit near the creek called on the Franklin
and Franklin Road, the said pieces of lands containing forty (40) acres land
or less, together with all and singular the buildings, houses, outbuildings and other
improvements belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the original and regular
boundaries and boundaries, roads, paths and footpath thereof. And also all the
other rights, titles, interests, property, possessions, claims and demands whatever
as well as less, at an equity of the said party of the first part, of which
the above described property and every part and parcel thereof, and the other
parts, do belong to hold all and singular the above mentioned and described
possessions together with the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part
and his heirs and assigns forever.
